

Africa Is Not A Country

Overview: In this lesson, students identify and dispel myths, stereotypes and “the single story” about Africa by creating an Animoto Public Service Announcement (PSA) video.

Together In Class

Your teacher will provide an introduction to this lesson including videos, an article and discussion. You will also review the Student Instructions, including the video rubric, the Myth/Reality/Illustration handout and the Animoto Public Service Announcement (PSA) Storyboard.

On Your Own

You may be working Individually, with a partner or in a small group at your teacher's discretion.

1. Using your headphones or earbuds, thoroughly peruse All of the videos and links found under Student Materials on the Weebly.
2. Create an extensive, detailed list of myths and stereotypes about Africa based on these materials and list these ideas on your Myth/Reality/Illustration handout. All students will be required to have AT LEAST 10 myths and realities identified. You may not end up using all of these in your video. You will be able to pick and choose your favorites or the most compelling.
3. Individually or together with your partner or small group, complete the Myth/Reality/Illustration handout by researching and identifying realities and illustrations (images) that could be used in your Animoto Public Service Announcement (PSA) video. Your ideas will evolve as you broaden and deepen your research. Revising and editing is good! In order to earn an Exemplary score, you will need to include at least one unique myth or stereotype not identified by other groups.
4. When your Myth/Reality/Illustration handout is finished, have your teacher approve it before proceeding.
5. Together with your group, complete the Animoto Public Service Announcement (PSA) video Storyboard. Your video should include at least 5 myths/realities and 15 frames. You must identify the exact URL of each image that you plan on using in your video. Use a URL shortener such as Goo or TinyURL to shorten the URLs before adding them to your Storyboard.

6. Before you begin your Animoto video, your teacher will provide you with detailed Animoto account instructions.

8. Create your Animoto video. Remember your video must include at least 5 myths/realities and 15 frames.

Note: Only one person in a group can be logged in to Animoto at a time. Those who are not actually working in Animoto should be locating images, planning out text, suggesting ideas for style, music, order of slides, etc.

9. When your Animoto video is finished, submit the link to the video to your teacher.
